The Smile of Every Child is Truly a Beautiful Thing

Autism is a word that few people know the definition of. That's because ten years ago only one in every 100,000 children were born with Autism, today however, one in every 188 children are stricken with Autism.



"A psychiatric disorder of childhood characterized by deficits in communication and social interaction, preoccupation with fantasy, language impairment, an abnormal behavior, such as repetitive acts and excessive attachment to certain objects. It is usually associated with intellectual impairment."

Scott Susens, long time business associate of Martin Woodall, introduced Woodall Foundation to the Autistic Treatment Center of Dallas.

Located in North Dallas, the organization had just recently moved into their new building after

a four year fundraising campaign. The new doors were opened but one of the most urgent needs had not been met through the Capital Campaign. The equipment for the Sensory Integration Therapy Clinic. People with Autism are affected by a disorder known as Dysfunctional Sensory Integration.

"DSI is a complex neurological disorder that interferes with how an individual's brain processes sensory input. This only adds to the difficulties people with Autism already battle in learning."

The clinic will not only serve individuals enrolled at ATC, but also the community through outpatient programs.

"The Center offers an array of services allowing for choices in living options, educational plans, vocational opportunities, training, diagnostics and assessment."

The Woodall Foundation, with financial support from Mark Cuban, is excited to announce the funding of a \$46,000 grant to the Autism Treatment Center of Dallas.

This grant will help complete four years of rapid growth and allow so many in need to take advantage of the therapy and programs at the Autistic Treatment Center of Dallas.
