

Each organization was asked to submit a detailed proposal of how they would benefit from a \$15,000 grant. The **Autism Treatment Center** requested funds to purchase much needed therapy equipment to service its membership. **Bryan's House** needed underwriting for a fire suppression system to ensure the safety of their students and staff at the new facility on South Beckley in Dallas. The **Cancer Support Community** required a sponsor for "Camp Noggie", their summer youth camp. The **Texas Discovery Gardens** needed funding to construct a permanent snake exhibit in the gardens in Fair Park. Once again picking just one of these equally deserving proposals proved to be too difficult. In the spirit of the holidays, on behalf of the Woodall Foundation board members, Martin informed all the beneficiaries that they would receive the necessary funding to support their projects and even personally delivered the checks himself.
