

Each organization was asked to submit a detailed proposal of how they would benefit from a \$15,000 grant. The **Autism Treatment Center** requested funds to purchase interactive white boards for use in their classrooms at both the Dallas and Ft Worth locations. **Bryan's House** needed underwriting to install new kitchen equipment, so they could provide quality meals to members at the South Beckley facility in Dallas. The **Cancer Support Community** submitted a proposal to replace their out of date technology equipment in the member and youth areas with new laptops and smart pads. The **Texas Discovery Gardens** needed funding to make updates on their classrooms as well as purchase materials for a new nature education library. On behalf of the Woodall Foundation board members, Martin was happy to inform all the beneficiaries that their proposals had been approved and the checks were on the way. 
