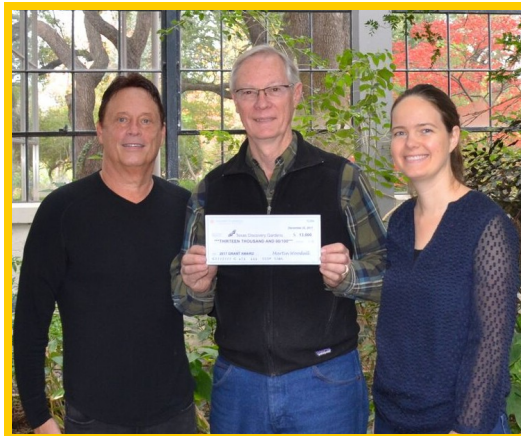
The **Cancer Support Community** needed a Noogieland sponsor to support their 2018 programming and events for children and teens.

The **Texas Discovery Gardens** requested funding to convert an unused paved area into a conservation canyon learning center focused on water reclamation and re-use.

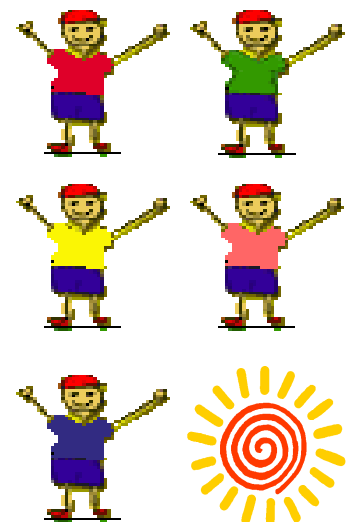
