The Woodall Foundation ended 2019 by awarding grants to each of our long time beneficiaries to help continue their amazing work in the community. Each organization was asked to submit a detailed proposal of how they would use their grant.

The **Autism Treatment Center** requested funds to furnish and supply their speech, occupational, physical and applied behavior analysis therapy clinic.

Bryan's House submitted a proposal to support the infant classroom in their childhood educational development program that supports infants born to moms with HIV.

The **Cancer Support Community** needed a Noogieland sponsor to support their 2020 programming and events for children and teens impacted by cancer in the family.

The **Texas Discovery Gardens** requested funding for a windmill and water pump addition to their conservation canyon project, that will help irrigate the gardens.


